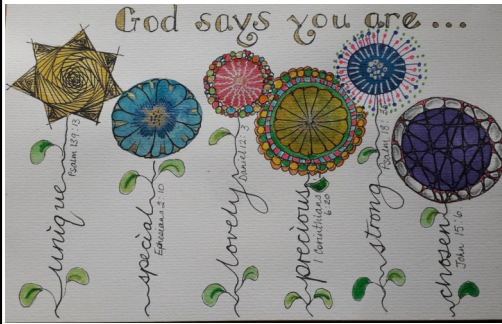


## Food Bank

Some pointers for the congregation

8. **At the 8.30am and Wednesday Holy Communion services, communion will be distributed by the minister coming down the aisle to the end of each pew rather than coming up to the altar in turn.**
9. After the service if the weather's good, people may choose to go outside and chat after the service. Don't congregate at the back of church. Because we need to clean the church.

## Collect & Readings

Almighty God, whose only Son has opened for us a new and living way into your presence: give us pure hearts and steadfast wills to worship you in spirit and in truth; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

### **Romans 14: 1-12**

Accept other believers who are weak in faith, and don't argue with them about what they think is right or wrong.<sup>2</sup> For instance, one person believes it's all right to eat anything. But another believer with a sensitive conscience will eat only vegetables.<sup>3</sup> Those who feel free to eat anything must not look down on those who don't. And those who don't eat certain foods must not condemn those who do, for God has accepted them.<sup>4</sup> Who are you to condemn someone else's servants? Their own master will judge whether they stand or fall. And with the Lord's help, they will stand and receive his approval.<sup>5</sup> In the same way, some think one day is more holy than another day, while others think every day is alike. You should each be fully convinced that whichever day you choose is acceptable.<sup>6</sup> Those who worship the Lord on a special day do it to honour him. Those who eat any kind of food do so to honour the Lord, since they give thanks to God before eating. And those who refuse to eat certain foods also want to please the Lord and give thanks to God.<sup>7</sup> For we don't live for ourselves or die for ourselves.<sup>8</sup> If we live, it's to honour the Lord. And if we die, it's to honour the Lord. So

whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord.<sup>9</sup> Christ died and rose again for this very purpose—to be Lord both of the living and of the dead.<sup>10</sup> So why do you condemn another believer? Why do you look down on another believer? Remember, we will all stand before the judgment seat of God.<sup>11</sup> For the Scriptures say, “‘As surely as I live,’ says the LORD, ‘every knee will bend to me, and every tongue will declare allegiance to God.’”

### **Matthew 18: 21-35**

<sup>21</sup> Then Peter came to him and asked, “Lord, how often should I forgive someone who sins against me? Seven times?”<sup>22</sup> “No, not seven times,” Jesus replied, “but seventy times seven!”<sup>23</sup> “Therefore, the Kingdom of Heaven can be compared to a king who decided to bring his accounts up to date with servants who had borrowed money from him.<sup>24</sup> In the process, one of his debtors was brought in who owed him millions of dollars.<sup>25</sup> He couldn't pay, so his master ordered that he be sold—along with his wife, his children, and everything he owned—to pay the debt.<sup>26</sup> “But the man fell down before his master and begged him, ‘Please, be patient with me, and I will pay it all.’<sup>27</sup> Then his master was filled with pity for him, and he released him and forgave his debt.<sup>28</sup> “But when the man left the king, he went to a fellow servant who owed him a few thousand dollars. He grabbed him by the throat and demanded instant payment.<sup>29</sup> “His fellow servant fell down before him and begged for a little more time. ‘Be patient with me, and I will pay it,’ he pleaded.<sup>30</sup> But his creditor wouldn't

wait. He had the man arrested and put in prison until the debt could be paid in full.<sup>31</sup> “When some of the other servants saw this, they were very upset. They went to the king and told him everything that had happened.<sup>32</sup> Then the king called in the man he had forgiven and said, ‘You evil servant! I forgave you that tremendous debt because you pleaded with me.<sup>33</sup> Shouldn't you have mercy on your fellow servant, just as I had mercy on you?’<sup>34</sup> Then the angry king sent the man to prison to be tortured until he had paid his entire debt.<sup>35</sup> “That's what my heavenly Father will do to you if you refuse to forgive your brothers and sisters from your heart.”

### Post Communion

Lord God, the source of truth and love, keep us faithful to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, united in prayer and the breaking of bread, and one in joy and simplicity of heart, in Jesus Christ our Lord.
