lob 23: 1-9, 16-17

Then Job replied: ² "Even today my complaint is bitter; his hand is heavy in spite of my groaning. ³ If only I knew where to find him; if only I could go to his dwelling! ⁴I would state my case before him treasure in heaven. Then come, and fill my mouth with arguments. ⁵I would find out what face fell. He went away sad, he would answer me, and consider what he would say to me. ⁶Would he vigorously oppose me? No, he would not press charges against me. ⁷There the upright can establish their innocence before him, and there I would be delivered forever from my judge.⁸ "But if I go to the east, he is not there; if I go to the west, I do not find him. ⁹ When he is at work in the north. I do not see him; when he turns to the south, I catch no glimpse of him. ¹⁶ God has made my heart faint; the Almighty has terrified me. ¹⁷ Yet I am not silenced by the darkness, by the thick darkness that covers my face.

Mark 10: 17-31

¹⁷ As lesus started on his way, a knees before him. "Good teacher," he asked, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" ¹⁸ "Why do you call me good?" Jesus answered. "No one is good whole creation the joys of eternal except God alone. ¹⁹ You know the commandments: 'You shall not murder, vou shall not commit adultery, you shall not steal, you shall not give false testimony, you shall not defraud, honour your father and mother." ²⁰ "Teacher," he declared, "all these I have kept since I was a boy."²¹ Jesus looked at him and loved him. "One thing you lack," he said. "Go, sell everything you have and give to the poor, and you will have follow me." ²² At this the man's because he had great wealth. ²³ lesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it is for the rich to enter the kingdom of God!"²⁴ The disciples were amazed at his words. But lesus said again, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! ²⁵ It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God."²⁶The disciples were even more amazed, and said to each other, "Who then can be saved?"²⁷ Jesus looked at them and said, "With man this is impossible, but not with God; all things are possible with God." ²⁸ Then Peter spoke up, "We have left everything to follow you!"

²⁹ "Truly I tell you," Jesus replied, "no one who has left home or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields for me and the gospel ³⁰ will fail to receive a hundred times as much in this present age: homes, brothers, sisters, mothers, children and fields—along with persecutions and in the age to come eternal life. ³¹ But many who are first will be last, and the last first."
